



ORDINANCE

DELETING UNENFORCEABLE NON-PUBLIC MEETING PROVISIONS AND URGING BOARDS TO INVITE MAYOR AND ALDERMEN TO PARTICIPATE

CITY OF NASHUA

In the year Two-Thousand Six

The City of Nashua ordains that Chapter 2 “Administration”, Article I “In General”, Section 2-5 “Non-public sessions”, subparagraph (3) of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, be further amended by deleting the struck-through language and adding the new underlined language as follows:

(3) The boards, commissions, committees and authorities of all other city agencies are urged to invite ~~not to exclude~~ the mayor and aldermen ~~or any alderman from the any~~ to non-public sessions ~~nor deny the mayor or any alderman access to minutes of any such session at which issues are discussed that are relevant to decisions, deliberations or votes made by the mayor or Board of Aldermen. In the absence of a specific vote to the contrary, it shall be presumed that no board, commission, committee, or authority intends to exclude or deny access to the mayor and members of the board of aldermen to any non-public session or to the minutes thereof.~~

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
