### ADOPTING THE 2010 – 2015 CONSOLIDATED PLAN, THE REVISED CITIZEN PARTICIPATION PLAN, AND THE DOWNTOWN NASHUA NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION STRATEGY AREA

### *CITY OF NASHUA*

*In the Year Two Thousand and Ten*

**RESOLVED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Nashua that

WHEREAS the City of Nashua, as a recipient of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME Investment Partnership funds, must prepare a “Consolidated Plan” for approval by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) every three to five years. The Consolidated Plan is a strategic plan that provides a course of action for building livable communities throughout the City. The Plan describes the City’s goals and objectives for its HUD funds to address priority needs related to affordable housing, homelessness, non-homeless special needs populations and community development, which includes economic development, revitalization, community infrastructure, and public services; and

WHEREAS the City of Nashua’s Citizen Participation Plan, last updated in 2006, has been revised to reflect the requirements of 24 CFR 91.105; and

WHEREAS the Federal Register published on January 5, 1995 authorized entitlement grantees to develop comprehensive approaches to address economic development and housing needs in a designated neighborhood within their community. This approach is referred to as a Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Area (NRSA). The City has elected to designate a “Downtown Nashua NRSA”.

NOW THEREFORE the Mayor and Board of Aldermen hereby adopt by reference the “Consolidated Plan of the City of Nashua for the period of July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2015”, the “Citizen Participation Plan” and the “Downtown Nashua NRSA”. These Plans are on file for inspection at the City Clerk’s Office and the Community Development Division, City Hall, 229 Main Street; and the Nashua Public Library, 2 Court Street.
