RELATIVE TO THE TRANSFER OF \$15,000 FROM ACCOUNT 591-86005 "FY2010 GENERAL CONTINGENCY" INTO ACCOUNT 503-11 "BOARD OF ALDERMEN, PAYROLL – FULL TIME"

ASSIGNMENT:**

FISCAL NOTE: Reduces anticipated FY 2010 General Fund surplus. Position would be temporary unless funded in FY11 budget. The full-time annual cost including benefits would be approximately \$75,000.

ANALYSIS

This legislation authorizes the transfer of \$15,000 from Account 591-86005 "FY2010 General Contingency" into Account 503-11 "Board of Aldermen, Payroll – Full Time" for the purpose of funding a new position for the remainder of FY2010 – an Aldermanic Research Specialist to perform research projects and information gathering for the Board of Aldermen. The position is also not funded in the Fiscal Year 2011 Mayor's Proposed Budget.

Charter Sec. 53 permits the Board of Aldermen to transfer any unencumbered appropriation balance or any portion thereof from one department, fund or agency to another.

NRO § 5-130, H provides that "when proposed legislation to transfer or reappropriate a particular appropriation or portion thereof has had its first reading, such funds shall not be expended or transferred while the legislation is pending".
