



## ORDINANCE

### ALLOWING PERMITTED OVERNIGHT ON-STREET PARKING ON A PORTION OF ASH STREET

### *CITY OF NASHUA*

*In the Year Two Thousand and Seventeen*

*The City of Nashua ordains* that Part II “General Legislation”, Chapter 320 “Vehicles and Traffic”, Article XIII “Night Parking” Section 320-78.1 “Overnight on-street parking program in designated downtown areas”, subsection E of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, be and hereby is further amended by adding the following new underlined language in the appropriate alphabetical order:

**“320-78.1. Overnight on-street parking program in designated downtown areas.**

There shall be a program for on-street overnight parking as described below.

...

E. Streets where overnight parking is permitted; designated spaces.

(1) The streets where overnight parking is permitted are as follows:

Name of Street	Location

<u>Ash Street</u>	<u>West side, from Kinsley Street to Lake Street”</u>
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All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby superseded only to the extent necessary to effectuate this legislation.

This ordinance shall become effective when the necessary signage and pavement markings are in place.

**FISCAL NOTE:** Revenue: minimal permit fee of \$10. Some loss of revenue from overnight parking tickets. Estimated cost of materials, labor, and vehicle overhead for signage only: \$363.

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**ANALYSIS**

This legislation adds the west side of Ash Street, between Kinsley Street and Lake Street, to the overnight on-street parking program. Pursuant to subsection A(1) of the ordinance, residents of the streets where overnight parking is permitted are allowed to purchase an annual permit, with a maximum number of 400 permits to be issued.
