Bill Text: **AMENDING THE WASTEWATER SYSTEM FUND WITH REGARD TO IDENTIFYING AND LIMITING THE SCOPE OF WORK AND CALLING FOR ANNUAL DETAILED SUMMARY REPORTS TO THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN**
In the Year Two Thousand and Three The City of Nashua ordains that Chapter 18 "Sewers and Sewage Disposal", Article V "Sewer Use Fees", Section 18-181 "Wastewater system fund", subsection (a) of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, be further amended by deleting language in strikethrough and adding new language in underline as follows: "(a) The wastewater system fund shall be a legal and accounting entity of the city. All revenues from sewer use fees, connection charges and any other revenues related to the collection and treatment of wastewater will be credited to this fund and all expenditures for the operation and maintenance of the system, including contract summary and change orders as well as a scope of work for each contract or change order related to the EPA consent decree associated with the separation of wastewater and storm water and/or storage facilities as well as other designs presented for approval shall contain only items related to the storage treatment and separation of wastewater or storm water and conveyance systems. Submission of plans and/or change orders shall contain only what is necessary to complete and restore disturbed areas as deemed appropriate by the Board of Public Works and the Board of Aldermen. Appropriate uses also include capital replacement and improvements will be charged to this fund. A detailed summary of these plans shall be updated yearly and submitted to the board of aldermen for review. and other obligations of the system, including capital replacements and improvements, will be charged to this fund. The earnings and other reserves of the system will be retained in this fund. Surplus retained earnings will not be used for any purpose other than those specified above without the prior approval of the Board of Public Works and the Board of Aldermen" All other ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This ordinance shall become effective upon passage.
